Dr. Vanthida Huang is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Pharmacy Practice at Mercer University College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences. Dr. Huang has set up the infectious disease laboratory at the college and clinical practice site at Piedmont Hospital.

Dr. Huang received her PharmD and BSPharm from the Temple University School of Pharmacy in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. After receiving her PharmD, Dr. Huang completed a one-year ASHP Accredited Pharmacy Practice Residency at Sarasota Memorial Hospital in Florida followed by a two-year ACCP-Approved Fellowship in Infectious Diseases Pharmacotherapy at Wayne State University and Detroit Receiving Hospital in Detroit, Michigan. Dr. Huang was awarded the American College of Clinical Pharmacy, Merck Infectious Diseases Research Fellowship Award her second year of her training.

Dr. Huang's research interest is in infectious diseases pharmacotherapy, specifically, multidrug-resistant gram-positive bacteria including heteroresistance among methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* (MRSA) as well as antimicrobial pharmacodynamics and pharmacokinetics. She currently collaborates in research projects with investigators from CDC, Emory University, Morehouse University, University of Georgia, and Wayne State University. She has published her research in peer reviewed journals such as *Antimicrobial Agents and Chemotherapy*, *Pharmacotherapy*, *Journal of Antimicrobial Agents*, *Infectious Diseases in Clinical Practice*, and *Annals of Pharmacotherapy*. She received the Mercer University College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences Excellence in Research Award in 2007.
