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Dr. Peter G. Pappas is Professor of Medicine in the Division of Infectious Diseases and Tinsley Harrison Clinical Scholar, Department of Medicine at the University of Alabama in Birmingham. Dr. Pappas serves as Principal Investigator (PI) for the NIAID Mycoses Study Group. He is also the PI of a national network of transplant centers, TRANSNET, in conjunction with CDC. TRANSNET provides epidemiologic and treatment information concerning transplant recipients who develop proven and probable invasive fungal infections. Dr. Pappas is also the co-PI of the Organ Transplant Infection Detection and Prevention Program (OTIPP), a collaborative multicenter group funded through CDC.

After graduating Phi Beta Kappa from UAB, Dr. Pappas went on to complete his medical degree at UAB. Subsequently, he completed his internship and residency training at the University of Washington in Seattle, Washington, where he also completed a fellowship in Infectious Diseases.

Dr. Pappas is the author or co-author of numerous abstracts presented at national and international congresses; articles in peer-reviewed journals, such as *New England Journal of Medicine* and *Clinical Infectious Diseases*; and books and book chapters. Topics include the treatment and prevention of invasive fungal infections in hospitalized patients, transplant recipients and HIV-infected patients. His research interests include the epidemiology and treatment of invasive fungal infections (IFIs) and antifungal combination therapy. Recent work has focused on IFIs in high-risk patients, such as transplant recipients. Dr. Pappas is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians.
