Dr. Andrew Krystal, MD, MS is Ray and Dagmar Dolby Distinguished Professor of Psychiatry and Neurology and Vice Chair of Research at the University of California San Francisco School of Medicine in San Francisco, CA. He is also Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the Duke University School of Medicine in Durham, NC.

Dr. Krystal received his Bachelor of Science and Master of Science in Engineering from M.I.T. followed by a medical degree from Duke University in Durham, NC. He completed his psychiatric residency at the Duke University Medical Center followed by a fellowship in sleep disorders and clinical neurophysiology.

He is an internationally-recognized expert in the areas of mood and sleep disorders. He has more than 25 years of clinical and research experience in these areas. The main foci of his work have been the development of means to improve the risk-benefit ratio of brain stimulation therapies for mood disorders and studies on the pathophysiology of treatment of sleep disorders.

He is the recipient of several awards including the APA residents scholarship, Laughlin fellow from the American College of Psychiatrists, NARSAD Young Investigator Award, NIMH Scientist Development Award for clinicians, and the APA Research Mentorship award.
